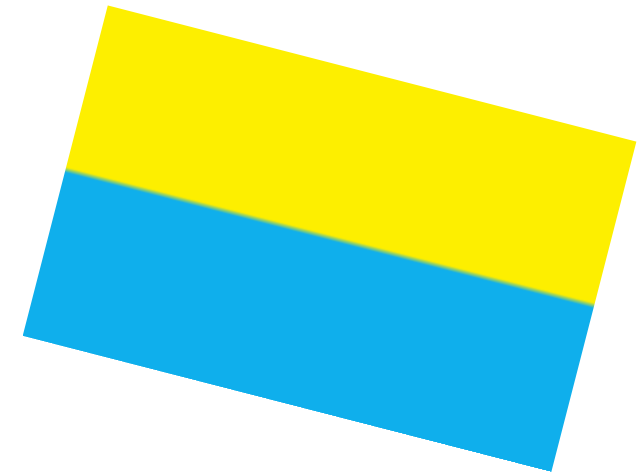

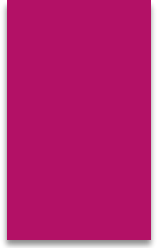
Comparison of Opole and Altamura

Basic information about Opole

- ▶ Opole – a city located in south-western Poland, the seat of the authorities of the Opolskie Voivodeship and the Opole County. The river Odra flows through the city.
- ▶ President: Arkadiusz Wiśniewski
- ▶ City area: 149km²
- ▶ The number of residents: 126 755





Culture of Opole

- ▶ Opole is called the capital of Polish Song. The National Festival of Polish Song in Opole is an annual music festival. Together with the Sopot Festival it is one of the two most important music festivals in Poland. The event takes place every year in June.



Basic information about Altamura

- ▶ Altamura is a town and comune of Apulia, in southern Italy. It is located on one of the hills of the Murge plateau in the Metropolitan City of Bari, 45 kilometres southwest of Bari, close to the border with Basilicata. As of 2017, its population amounts to 70,595 inhabitants.
- ▶ City area: 427 km²
- ▶ Mayor: Francesco Rinaldi





Culture of Altamura

- ▶ Pane di Altamura is a type of Italian naturally leavened bread made from remilled durum wheat semola from the Altamura area.



- ▶ Federicus is a historical reenactment event that takes place every year in the historic city centre of Altamura. The event usually takes place in the second half of April, and it normally lasts three days.
